

## Earring project to learn wrapped loops on 2/6

This project is really a lesson in perfecting wrapped loops which can be used in so many ways. Below is a sample of a deconstructed earring and a finished earring. I will provide all the eye pins and head pins needed for practice and for the finished project. That way no one need invest in the pins until you know you like using the technique. Here is the suggested supply list per pair of earrings :

2- focal beads. Pictured are 15mm coins. 10-20mm flat or slightly puffed rounds suggested  
6- accent beads 6-8 mm. Round or rondelle or a mix, depending on your focal bead  
6 - or more flat spacer beads for textural interest

6 - 3-4 mm bicones, rounds or pearls

Pair of Ear-wires of your choice

Eye pins and headpins will be provided

Tools required:

Chain nose ( needle - nose flat blade) pliers

Round nose (needle-nose round blade) pliers

Flush cutter pliers

Note: the first six elements listed below in the picture should not add up to more than 40mm when strung on a pin, otherwise, your finished earring might be too long and heavy.

**PLEASE BRING YOUR READING GLASSES OR SAFTY GLASSES (if you normally wear glasses, you're covered) BECAUSE SMALL PIECES OF METAL WILL BE FLYING AROUND!**

As always, if this project doesn't interest you, bring something else to work on and hang out with the group! Please let me know if you are coming on 2/6.
