Note about Art and Garden: ART & GARDEN: On Friday, March 6, we have an 11:30 am docent tour of the "Violins of Hope, A Journey of Heroism, Healing and Humanity" Exhibit at the Veterans Gallery, War Memorial Veterans Gallery, in San Francisco. The exhibit is free and we will lunch in SF after our tour. We meet at 9:30 am to carpool to the Walnut Creek BART. This exhibit showcases a selection of violins that were played by Jewish musicians at Auschwitz and other camps. Amnon Weinstein began collecting and restoring the violins more than 20 years ago, and the collection is dedicated to the 400 family members he lost in WWII. These instruments are symbols of peace and the power of music on the human spirit. During the Holocaust, the role of music — and specifically the violin — was complicated. Auschwitz had eight orchestras. Commanders would order them played for a variety of reasons, from executions to labor marches or purely for the pleasure of the Gestapo. Ultimately, however, the music gave prisoners hope in unimaginable conditions. Since restoration, the instruments have been played by prominent musicians in venues worldwide, giving voice not only to the owners of the violins, but also to the millions of Jewish people who perished.
