
Schematic Tour Map

Tropical Desert

A stylish landscape designed around a rare collection of mature palms, yuccas, agaves, cacti and cycads. This uniquely creative space includes amazing plants along with a special pool and pergola. Strong Mediterranean colors and shapes predominate. The owner will be on hand to share his expertise.

Level with ample parking.

◆ 564 El Pintado Rd Danville Mediterranean Villa

Tour a 1.2- acre Tuscan-inspired estate with tiered gardens featuring exotic grasses, wildflowers, succulents, mature olive trees, and a 400-year-old oak. Stroll past palms and bougainvillea by the pool, through redwoods to 179 Merlot vines, olive trees, roses, and potted plants. Fragrant white roses and vibrant succulents complete the scene.

Limited parking at garden. Park on El Pintado past lane to house.



Colorful Natural Setting

Botanically generous gardens surround a unique home built of red brick in the 1930s. The landscape was designed to blend into the natural hillside and provide year-around color. The beautiful intricate fencing was created by Lafayette Iron Works and the pillars and paths by Charles Toney of "World-Class Masonry."

This 1924 estate was awarded a "classic" destination and visited by President Hoover, a friend of the original owners. A two-year renovation was undertaken in 1999 by the current family who have enjoyed this home since 1987. The elegant landscape of 1.5 acres is designed for country living and includes a pool, treehouse and rose arbor.
